




Amari and the Night Brothers





Following Frankenstein



Adam-2



When the Sky Falls







Can Oscar and Edie navigate their friendship now they've started secondary school? Edie discovers things about herself she had never realised. A great read celebrating friendship and differences.



Show Us Who You Are



Children of the Quicksands


