




Theme Overview


The first topic in Year 1 is a three week unit called, 'Tell Us a Story. It is all about fairy stories and traditional tales. During this unit we will be learning in different ways, building on from the way they learn in continuous provision in Reception. We will be listening to different stories and use a range of props to help us retell them. We will also be talking about the characters and the things they get up to in their story.

Please read, listen to and watch as many fairy stories and traditional tales as possible. Stories have a lot more to offer than just entertainment value. They introduce children to the idea of storytelling, promote social skills and boost language development. They also lay the foundation for learning to read, spell and write.









Overview

Jack and the Beanstalk

Focus on this well-known story. Identify different types of beans. Encourage imagination and creativity, counting and measuring giants footsteps. Find out about giant animals.

Snow White

Use a range of drama tecniques to look at the characters in the story and create new ones. Identify fruit and vegetables and discuss healthy eating. Talk about a range of materials and their purposes.

Cinderella

Become familiar with the story, using a range of props. Create storymaps to retell the tale. Introduce time and identify change in the story. Design a crown for Cinderella.

Learning to Listen

Focus on the difference between hearing and listening and why it is important to listen. Practise ways to communicate with each other. Listen to and name different sounds.
